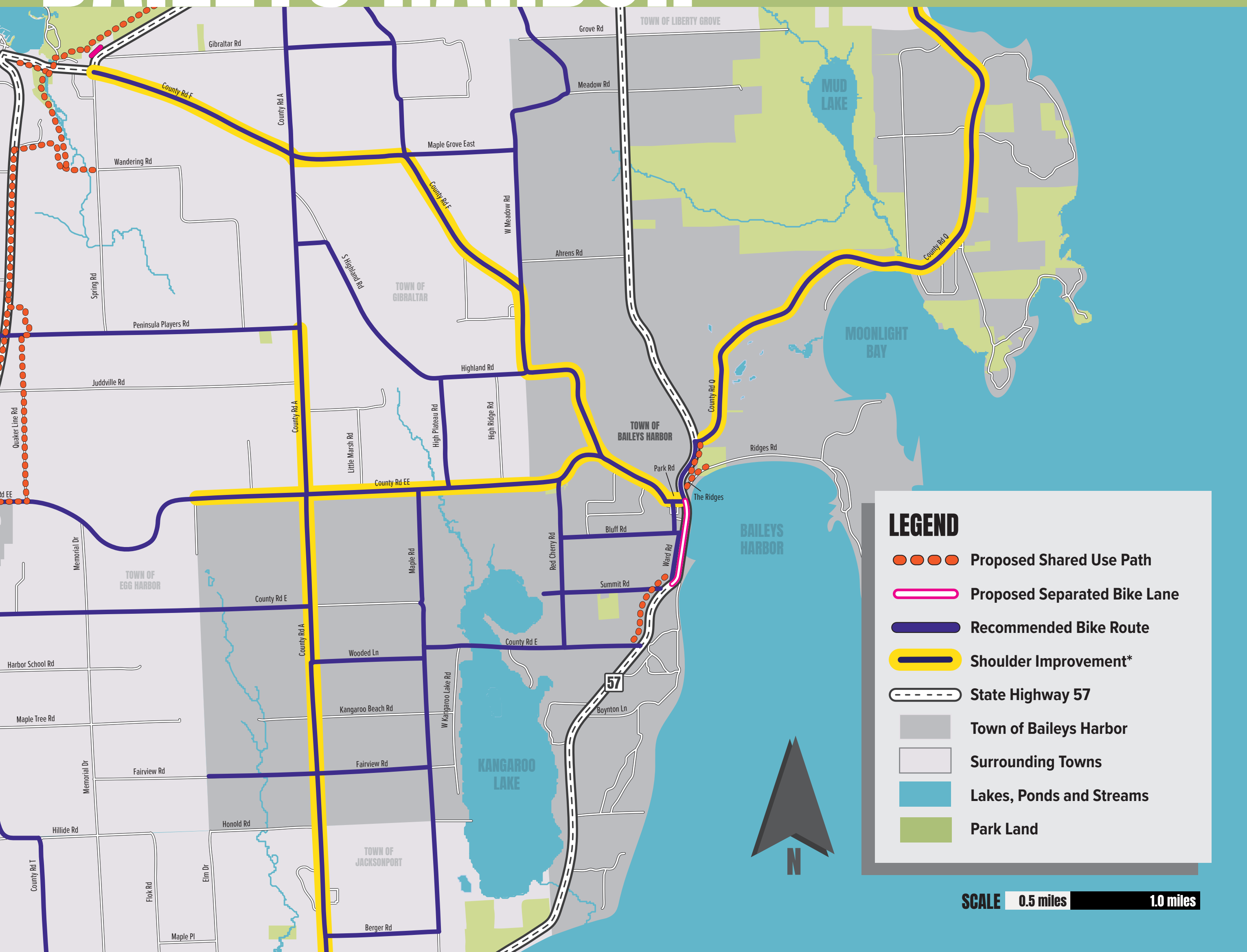


TOWN OF BAILEYS HARBOR

DOOR COUNTY GREEN FUND TRAILS TASK FORCE

The following map shows the existing and proposed trail network within the Town of Baileys Harbor. This map is part of the Door County Trail Connection Network, a series of maps and resources for existing, proposed and future trail opportunities in Door County.



Overview

The Town of Baileys Harbor offers a large amount of on-road cycling options identified by the County's Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. From the various county roads to many of the Town roads, there are many options for cycling through Baileys Harbor. In addition to the county's bike routes, the Town would like to pursue an on-road bike lane in the downtown area, stretching from Summit Road to Park Road.

The Town has also been discussing the idea of a shared-use path from Ward Street to Summit Road. This would be an off-road path open to walking and biking. Lastly, the Ridges, which is located to the north of the downtown area has recently put in place a Master Plan that includes some trail options. The plan calls for developing a pathway along Ridges Road from Highway 57 to the Ridges County Beach as well as along Highway 57 from Ridges Road to County Road Q.

DEFINITIONS*

Shared Use Path - Allowed uses include all non-motorized activity such as walking and biking. Trails are also accessible.

Separated Bike Lane - A bike lane facility separated from traffic and parking but still located on a paved road.

Recommended Bike Route - Roads that have been identified as recommended for cycling.

Shoulder Improvement - County Highways recommended for shoulder improvements for cyclists.

** Improvements can range from physical shoulder expansion to restriping of the road. Improvements may or may not be made based on priority of road enhancements and funding.*

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
